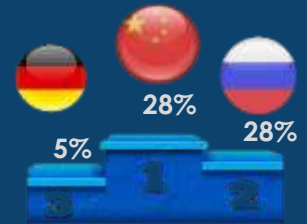

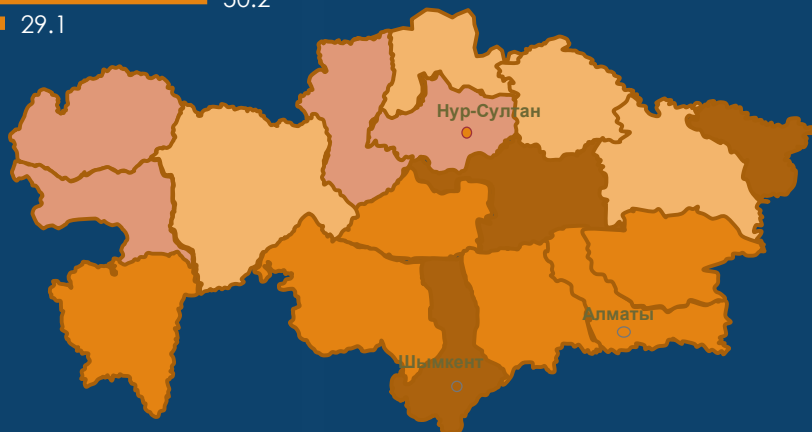

ПРОИЗВОДСТВО В РЕГИОНАХ, МЛРД ТЕНГЕ

January-July 2023: Rubber and plastic products

Rubber and plastic products were produced at 248.9 billion tenge in January-July 2023, an increase of 15.7% over 2022.

For the analyzed period, plastic plates, sheets, pipes and profiles accounted for 41.6% of rubber and plastic product production, building plastic products accounted for 19.4%, other plastic products accounted for 17.3%, plastic packaging for goods accounted for 15.6%, and other rubber products accounted for 6.1%.

A volume index of 108% was calculated for the analyzed period. Physically, the largest increase is shown in polyethylene bags and bags (including conical ones) (+0.9%); pipes, tubes, sleeves, hoses and their fittings, of plastics (1.6%). Consumer demand increases as these goods grow in popularity.

Comparing January-June 2023 with the same period of 2022, rubber and plastic exports increased by 3.2 times to 193.2 million dollars. increased by 3.2 times to 193.2 million dollars. A majority of rubber and plastic products were exported to Russia (80%), Kyrgyzstan (9%) and Uzbekistan (5%).

January-May 2023 saw imports of rubber and plastic products rise 35.4% over the same period in 2022 to USD 1,211.8 million. China (28%), Russia (28%), and Germany (5%) accounted for the majority of rubber and plastic imports.

January-June 2023 saw a market volume of **1,486.9 million US dollars (667.4 billion tenge)**, an increase of **18.7% over 2022**. The share of OTPs decreased by 10 percentage points despite an increase in production (+12.1%). Growth of 18.5% is primarily driven by imports (+35.4%) and the formation of the national exchange rate (+1.4%). There was an 81.5% share of imported products.

Almaty region produces the most rubber and plastic products in January-July 2023. The regions of Astana (22%), Almaty (12%), and Karaganda (14%). (8%), and Shymkent (6%).
