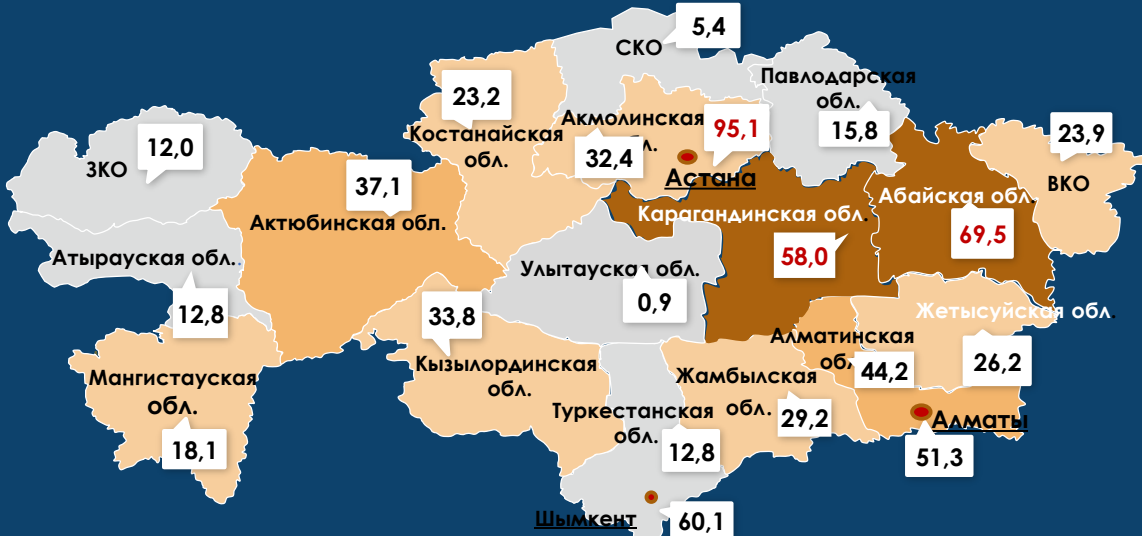

ОБЪЕМ ПРОИЗВОДСТВА В РАЗРЕЗЕ РЕГИОНОВ ЗА ЯНВАРЬ-ИЮЛЬ 2023 Г., МЛРД ТЕНГЕ



A review of the construction materials industry infographic from January-July 2023

In terms of nominal terms, the volume of construction materials produced in Kazakhstan during January-July 2023 was **661.8 billion tenge**, which is **14.1%** higher than the same period in 2022 (**579.9 billion tenge**).

During January-July 2023, the **physical volume of production** increased by **100.4%**. In terms of physical volume, fire-resistant products increased by **14.1%**; non-refractory ceramic bricks increased by **38.1%**; silicate and slag bricks increased by **1.3%**; drywall increased by **0.3%**; and building mortars increased by **13.7%**.

A total of **\$127.8 million** was **exported of construction materials products** in January-June 2023 compared to the same period in 2022. In terms of **physical volume**, exports increased by **10.6% to 733.9 thousand tons**, compared to **663.4 thousand tons** last year. Three countries are the top exporters: Russia, Uzbekistan, and Kyrgyzstan.

The domestic imports of construction materials in January-June 2023 totaled **\$556.4 million**, a decline of **8.1%** over the same period in 2022. As a result of the decrease in quantity of goods, **1,383.9 thousand tons** were carried, a decrease of **27.6%** over January-June 2022. Russia, China, and Uzbekistan are the top importing countries.

A total of **\$1,660.3 million** was spent on construction materials in the Republic of Kazakhstan between January and June 2023, with OTP accounting for **66%**, and imported products accounting for **34%**.

For January-July of current year, the region of Astana produced **14.4%** of the nation's output, followed by the Abay region (**10.5%**), and the Shymkent region (**9.1%**).
