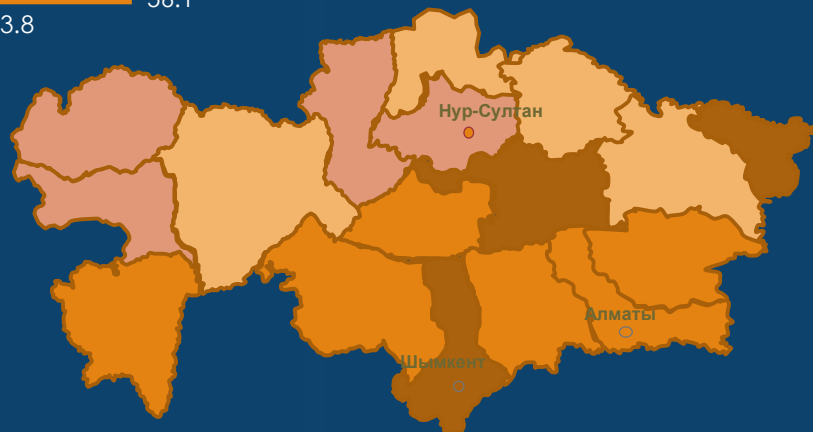
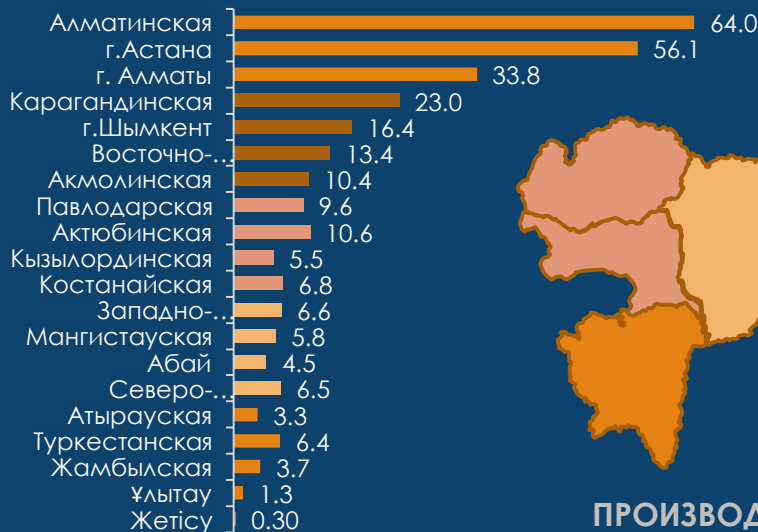

ПРОИЗВОДСТВО В РЕГИОНАХ, МЛРД ТЕНГЕ

January-August 2023: Rubber and plastic products

In January-July 2023, **rubber and plastic products were produced for 288.0 billion tenge, an increase of 13.6% compared with 2022.**

During the analyzed period, plastic plates, sheets, pipes, and profiles made up **42%** of rubber and plastic production, construction plastic products made up **19%**, other plastics were **17 percent**, plastic packaging for goods made up **15 percent**, and other rubber products accounted for 6 percent.

It is estimated that 107.5% of the total volume was produced in the analyzed period. The largest increase in production volumes in physical terms is shown by the production of bags and bags (including conical ones) made of polyethylene (+1.5%); pipes, tubes, sleeves and hoses, and their fittings made of plastic (3.7%). Consumer demand is associated with the growth of these goods.

Comparing January-July 2023 to the same period in 2022, rubber and plastic products exports increased 2.9 times to \$227.5 million. *Uzbekistan (5.1%), Kyrgyzstan (7.7%) and Russia (80.5%)* were the countries where rubber and plastic goods were exported in the largest volumes.

Rubber and plastic imports for January-July 2023 totaled \$1,441.4 million, which is 36% more than the same period in 2022. In terms of rubber and plastic imports, China accounted for **28 percent**, **Russia for 28 percent**, and **Germany for 5 percent**.

A market volume of 1,765.9 million US dollars (796.2 billion tenge) was recorded in January-July 2023, 21.4% higher than the same quarter in 2022. In spite of the increase in production (+ **15.7%**), the share of OTPs decreased by **8.8 percentage points**. Specifically, imports increased by **36.1%**, which accounted for **18.4%** of the increase. The share of imported products amounted to **81.6%**.

The largest volume of production of rubber and plastic products in January-August 2023 is noted in the following regions: Almaty region. (22.2%), Astana (19.5%), Almaty (11.7%), Karaganda region. (8%), Shymkent (5.7%).
