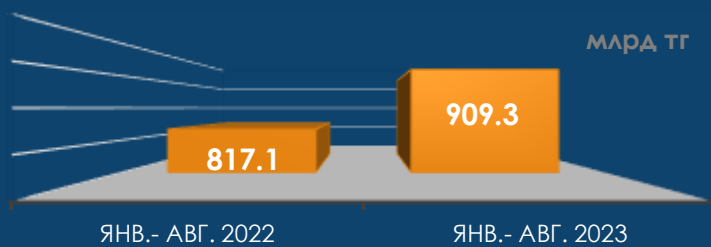

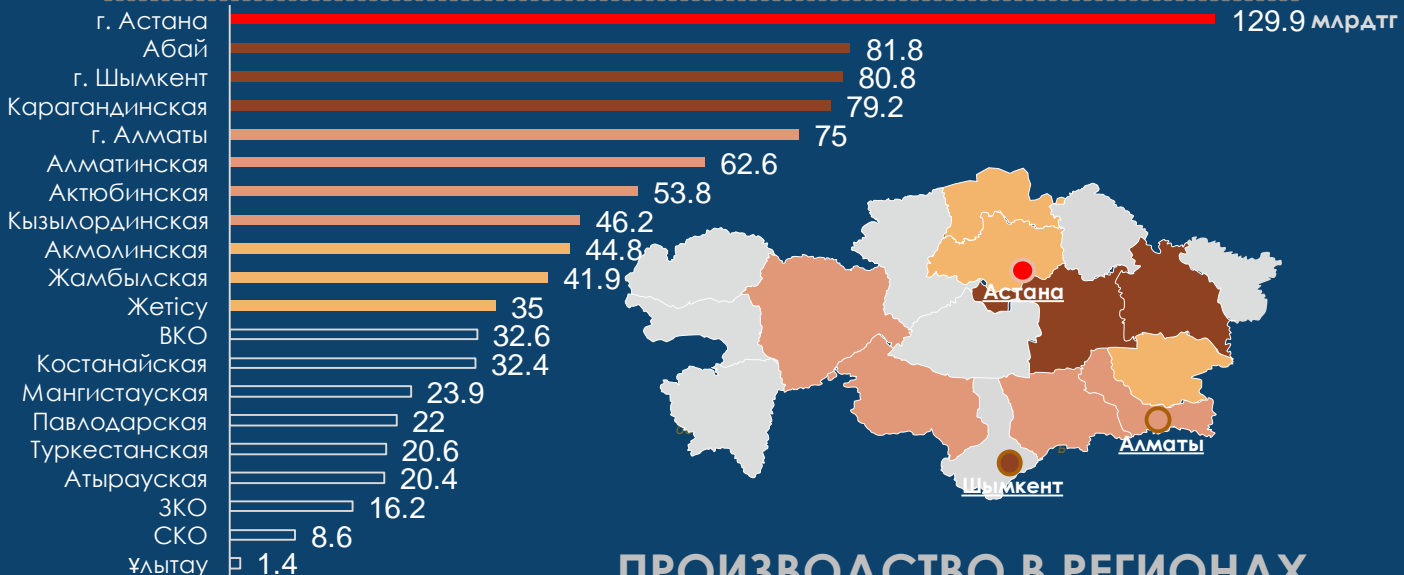

ПРОИЗВОДСТВО В РЕГИОНАХ

Production of construction materials January-September 2023

In nominal terms, the Republic of Kazakhstan produced **909.3 billion tenge** in construction materials from January to September 2023, which was **11.3%** higher than the same period in 2022 (**817.1 billion tenge**).

A **physical volume production index** of **100.9%** was recorded in January-September 2023. In terms of physical growth, the following goods are growing:

- *Fire-resistant products (+11.9%);*
- *Non-refractory ceramic bricks (+61%)*
- *Silicate and slag bricks (+2.2%)*
- *Tiles, slabs and similar products made of cement, concrete or artificial stone (+3.1%);*
- *Drywall (+0.6%);*
- *Building mortars (+15.8%)*

The **exports of construction materials products** in January-August 2023 increased by **30%** over the same period in 2022 and **reached \$178.5 million**. The volume of exports increased by **11.9%**, reaching **1,068.9 thousand tons**, compared to **954.9 thousand tons** last year. The three main countries that export to Russia are Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan.

A total of **\$802.7 million** worth of construction materials were imported into the domestic market from January-August 2023, a decrease of **4.7%** from the same period in 2022. The volume of goods decreased by **20.8%** from January-July 2022 to **2,048 thousand tons**. Uzbekistan, Russia, and China are the top importing countries.

The Republic of Kazakhstan's construction materials market volume for January-August 2023 was **\$2,370.2 million**, with OTP accounting for **66%** and imported products accounting for **34%**.

According to **value terms**, Astana produced **14.3%** of total production in January-September of the current year, Abay produced 9%, and Latakia produced 3%, Shymkent (8.9%).
